The following amendments to the Bylaws of the American Dental Association were approved by the House of Delegates at the 1963 and 1964 annual sessions

CHAPTER I • MEMBERSHIP

Section 20. Qualifications: A. Active Member. (lines 80-88) amended to read:

1653 A. Active Member. A dentist shall be classified as an active 1654 member of this Association who is licensed to practice in a 1655 state, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of 1656 Puerto Rico or a dependency of the United States, provid-1657 ing he is a member in good standing of this Association, its 1658 constitutent and component societies, if such exist, or is a 1659 member in good standing and licensed to practice in a 1660 dependency of the United States wherein a constituent 1661 society does not exist, or is a member of a federal dental 1662 service.

Section 30. Definition of "In Good Standing": (lines 132-138) amended by the addition of the following two paragraphs:

1663 A dentist who has been totally disabled during active mili-1664 tary duty and who is unable to practice dentistry within 1665 the definition of these Bylaws and who was a member in 1666 good standing at the time total disability was incurred may 1667 have his dues remitted upon certification by an agency of 1668 the federal government that the dentist is permanently and 1669 totally disabled in accordance with the standard schedule of 1670 rating disabilities in current use by the Veterans Adminis-1671 tration.

1672 A member of this Association who is totally disabled for a 1673 period of one year and who is unable to engage in the duties 1674 of the dental profession and who is a member in good stand-1675 ing at the time total disability was incurred, shall be exempt 1676 from the payment of dues and shall be in good standing 1677 during the period of total disability. A totally disabled mem-1678 ber, other than one totally disabled during active military 1679 service, in order to receive entitlement to dues exemption, 1680 shall submit through his component and constituent societies 1681 to this Association a medical certificate attesting total 1682 disability and a certificate from his component and con-1683 stituent societies attesting this total disability. During the 1684 period of exemption from dues, further such certificates 1685 shall be presented on request to this Association.

Section 50. Dues and Reinstatement: A. Active Members. (lines 192-193) amended to read:

1686 A. Active Members. The dues of active members shall be 1687 forty dollars (\$40.00) due on January 1 of each year.

G. Members Elected After July 1. (lines 211-216) amended to read:

1688 G. Members Elected After July 1. Active members elected to 1689 active membership in this Association for the first time, and 1690 who are elected after July 1, shall pay one-half $(\frac{1}{20})$ of the 1691 current year's dues, except that a student member, upon 1692 his classification as an active member by a constituent 1693 society shall pay no further dues for the remainder of the 1694 calendar year in which he was entitled to the benefits of 1695 student membership.

CHAPTER II • CONSTITUENT SOCIETIES

Section 30. Powers and Duties: (lines 248-250) amended to read:

1696 A. A constituent society shall have the power to elect its 1697 active and life members as active members of this Associa-1698 tion within the limits of Section 40 of this Chapter.

Section 40. Membership: (lines 265-283) amended to read:

1699 A. The active and life membership of each constituent 1700 society, except as otherwise provided in these *Bylaws*, shall 1701 be limited to dentists practicing within the territorial juris-1702 diction of such constituent society or to dentists in a federal 1703 dental service, provided that such dentists are in good 1704 standing in a component society thereof, if such exists, and 1705 provided that they are active or life members in good 1706 standing of this Association, or to a member of a federal 1707 dental service who has never practiced within the territorial 1708 limits of a component society and is a member in good 1709 standing of the constituent society and this Association.

1710 Explanatory Note: A dentist who has retired from active 1711 practice or who is engaged in activities furthering the object of 1712 this Association shall be considered to be practicing dentistry 1713 within the meaning of this section.

1714 B. Removal from One Jurisdiction to Another. A member who 1715 has changed the location of his practice from the jurisdiction 1716 of one constituent society to that of another constituent 1717 society may maintain active membership in the constituent 1718 society of which he is a member for the calendar year follow-1719 ing that of his removal from the jurisdiction of such society. The same privilege shall apply to a member who is separated 1721 from a federal dental service and who enters practice in an 1722 area under the jurisdiction of a constituent society. A den-

1723 tist who retires from active practice and establishes resi-1724 dence in an area outside of the jurisdiction of the constituent 1725 society in which he holds membership shall be permitted to 1726 continue his membership in such constituent society for the 1727 period of his retirement.

1728 C. Privileges. An active or life member in good standing shall 1729 enjoy all privileges of constituent society membership with-1730 out exception.

1731 D. A member may hold membership in two constituent 1732 societies with the consent of the constituent societies in-1733 volved. Such member shall pay dues to this Association 1734 only through the constituent society in whose jurisdiction 1735 he conducts the major part of his practice.

CHAPTER III • COMPONENT SOCIETIES

Section 20. Powers and Duties: (lines 392-394) amended to read:

1736 A. A component society shall have the power to elect its 1737 active and life members as active members of the con-1738 stituent society in accordance with Chapter II, Section 40, 1739 of these *Bylaws*.

And further amended by the addition of the following section (following line 402):

1740 Section 30. Privileges of Membership: An active or life mem-1741 ber in good standing shall have the opportunity of enjoying 1742 all privileges of component society membership without 1743 exception.

CHAPTER VI • BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section 10. Composition: (lines 711-717) amended to read:

1744 Section 10. Composition: The Board of Trustees shall con-1745 sist of one (1) trustee from each of the thirteen (13) trustee 1746 districts. Such thirteen (13) trustees, the President-elect 1747 and the three Vice-presidents shall constitute the voting 1748 membership of the Board of Trustees. In addition, the 1749 President and the appointive officers of the Association, 1750 except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, shall be 1751 ex officio members of the Board without the right to vote.

Section 20. Qualifications: (lines 718-725) amended to read:

1752 Section 20. Qualifications: A trustee must be an active or 1753 life member, in good standing, of this Association and an 1754 active or life member of one of the constituent societies 1755 which compose the trustee district he is elected to represent. 1756 Should the status of any trustee change in regard to the 1757 preceding qualifications during his term of office, that 1758 office shall be declared vacant by the President and he shall 1759 fill such vacancy as provided in Chapter VI, Section 70, of 1760 these Bylaws.

Section 90. Duties: Subsection A. (lines 799-801) amended to read:

1761 A. To provide for the purchase, sale, mortgage, maintenance 1762 and supervision of the Central Office and all other property 1763 or offices owned or operated by this Association.

Subsection O. (lines 834-835) amended to read:

1764 O. To establish other funds as divisions of the General Fund 1765 in accordance with the provisions of Chapter XV, Section 50.

1766 P. To perform such other duties as are prescribed by these 1767 Bylaws.

CHAPTER IX • COUNCILS

Section 110. Duties: Subsection Ba. Council on Dental Education. (lines 1108-1109) amended to read:

1768 a. To act as the agency of the Association in the evaluation 1769 and accreditation of dental education and associated 1770 subjects.

Subsection H. Council on Hospital Dental Service. (lines 1179-1188) amended to read:

1771 H. Council on Hospital Dental Service. The duties of the 1772 Council shall be:

a. To examine dental services in hospitals and patient

1774 care units other than hospitals and to issue, in the name 1775 of the American Dental Association, certificates of

1775 of the American Dental Association, certificates of 1776 approval to those institutions having dental services

which meet the basic standards or requirements established by the House of Delegates.

1770 b To get on behalf of the Aggeriation

b. To act on behalf of the Association in the inspection and improvement of dental services in hospitals and

1781 patient care units other than hospitals.

CHAPTER XV • FINANCES

Amended by the addition of the following section (following line 1575):

1782 Section 50. Other Funds: The Association may establish 1783 other funds, at the direction of the Board of Trustees, for 1784 activities and programs requiring separate accounting 1785 records to meet governmental and administrative require-1786 ments. Such funds shall consist of monies and other assets 1787 received or allocated in accordance with the purpose for 1788 which they are established. Such funds shall be used for 1789 defraying all expenses incurred in their operation, shall 1790 serve only as separate accounting entities and continue to 1791 be held in the name of the American Dental Association as 1792 divisions of the General Fund.
