

Edward Sanford Gaylord

Doctor Gaylord, of New Haven, Connecticut, was elected forty-eighth president of the Association at the 1910 meeting in Denver. This meeting was considered to be the golden anniversary of the Association, the first regular meeting having been held in 1860.

Doctor Gaylord practiced dentistry in New Haven for 60 consecutive years. He was the last president of the Association having only preceptorial training. Doctor Gaylord was president of the Connecticut State Dental Association in 1893. He was born in Connecticut in 1840 and died in 1926.

The Standard Oil Company and the American Tobacco Company were ordered dissolved by the Supreme Court in 1911, under the Sherman Anti-Trust Act. A dynamite explosion at the Los Angeles Times, resulting from a labor dispute, killed 21 persons. The international court of arbitration at The Hague settled the Newfoundland fisheries question, extending American privileges.
