

Frank O. Hetrick 1912–1913

Doctor Hetrick, of Ottawa, Kansas, was elected fiftieth president of the Association at the 1912 meeting in Washington.

Doctor Hetrick served as president of the Kansas State Dental Association and the National Board of Dental Examiners. For many years he was chairman of the Research Commission of the National Dental Association. He was born in Ohio in 1859 and died in 1934.

Woodrow Wilson was elected president in 1912, defeating William Howard Taft, Republican, and Theodore Roosevelt, Progressive. Theodore Roosevelt was shot and seriously wounded by a maniac in Milwaukee. Woman suffrage was adopted in Arizona, Kansas and Oregon, and rejected in Michigan and Wisconsin. The United States Department of Labor was established.
