### 2017 NODA Honor Dentist: Dr. Mark S. Chaney

 $\Gamma$  he recipient of the 2017 New Orleans Dental Association Honor Dentist award is Dr. Mark S. Chaney. Dr. Chaney will be presented with the award at the President's Banquet on March 10th at Basin St. Station. He is a 1989 graduate of the University of Mississippi School of Dentistry. Mark spent his youth in Tupelo, MS and graduated from Millsaps College. It was there that, during his junior year, he met the future Mrs. Daria Chaney, daughter of 2001 NODA Honor Dentist, Dr. Milford Kathmann. Mark credits Dr. Kathmann as the guiding force behind his pursuit of a career in dentistry. "I knew I wanted to be in the health care profession," said Dr. Chaney, "but Dr. Kathmann convinced me that the quality of life in dentistry

would far surpass any other health care field."

After graduating from dental school, Mark recalls the world wind of moving to New Orleans in June 1989, starting work with Dr. Kathmann on July 7, and getting married on October 28 that same year. At that point, Mark says he gained his primary mentor in dentistry and it was Dr. Kathmann who encouraged him to attend his first NODA General Membership meeting. Many months later, Dr. Chaney noticed his health insurance premiums through the dental association seemed to be inflating more than he expected. He decided to inquire, the culmination of which was an invitation by Dr. John Shea to attend the LDA Council on Insurance meeting. He recalls riding to Baton Rouge sitting between Drs. Jack Cassingham and Ned Ganucheau while Dr. Shea drove. He says the group of NODA leaders set their hooks in deep during that ride and the rest, as they say, is history. journey in organized dentistry had officially begun.

Dr. Chaney was Chairman of the LDA Council on Insurance from 1996 - 2001. He served numerous years as a delegate for NODA at the LDA House of Delegates. He worked on the LDA PAC Committee and was Chairman of the PAC Committee Golf Tournament in 2004. He was LDA Presi-

dent from 2003 - 04. He then transitioned to the LDA Annual Sessions committee, serving as Chairman from 2006 - 10. He was Chairman of the LDA Distinguished Service Award committee from 2010 - 17. He was President of the state chapter of the American College of Dentists in 2016. Dr. Chaney was a recipient of the 2016 LDA Distinguished Service Award.

He has also served at the national level, having been a member of the ADA House of Delegates from 2004 - 17 and serving on the ADA Council on Insurance and Membership Retirement Programs from 2012 - 16. Presently, he serves on the Audit Committee of the At the local level. Dr. Chaney has tirelessly participated in practically every committee possible. He started on the New Orleans Dental Conference committee in 1996. He was Chairman of the Allied Dental Association Insurance Trust from 1998 - 01. He was Secretary of the NODA Board of Governors from 1999 - 2001 and was NODA President in 2007. He has served on the New Orleans Dental Conference & LDA Annual Conference Session committee since 2007, holding the position of Chairman for the 2011 conference, and continues today as the Conference's treasurer. like many volunteer hours (and it is), it merely scratches the surface of his limitless devotion to our profession and his colleagues.

His selflessness extends to his community, where he remains active. He has been a member of the Krewe of Carrollton Mardi Gras organization since 1990. He is involved with his parish church, Mary Queen of Peace Catholic church and was active in the United Way agency, including leadership training for the latter.

Dr. Chaney continues to practice dentistry on Carrollton Avenue in the office where he began his career. He and Daria have three children: Christian (26) who completed law school at George Washington University and is in private practice, Nick (24) who is in his 2nd year of dental school at LSUSD, and Ericha (21) who just graduated from ULL in accounting and is pursuing a masters degree at UNO.

Mark credits many individuals with helping to guide his career. He says that his participation in organized dentistry enabled him to build strong relationships with so many friends, many of who have taught him how to be a better dentist. While he hesitated to provide names because there are so many people who have helped and guided him, he included Drs. Terry Walsh, Randy Green, Gary Roberts, and Les Tarver as among the many who have inspired him.

Many of Dr. Chaney's peers sing his praises. When asked about Dr. Chaney's influence on our profession, Dr. Kristi Soileau remarked "Dr. Chaney has been a driving force for NODA for many years. He consistently finds the energy to wear multiple hats while smiling all the way. We are so fortunate that this gentleman from Mississippi fell in love with a New Orleans belle." Dr. Frank Martello said, "Dr. Chaney reminds me of the Energizer bunny, but with a crisp white shirt and sharp tie. He has endless energy and is everywhere. proud to have him as a peer." Finally, Dr. Robert Barsley remarked "Over the years, I have worked together with Mark on many issues and I have come to truly respect his knowledge and his methods for solving potential problems at the outset whenever possible. delighted that he is being recognized for his contributions to this profession and our organizations."

Dr. Chaney has an optimistic outlook for dentistry. While he notes the countless changes that have occurred in the profession since his graduation from dental school, he says "The technological advances and improvements in dental materials that have occurred just within the last decade are allowing us to provide such a higher level of care to our patients that I can't wait to see what's around the corner" His advice to newer dentists is to "always be a student. Never stop learning and never lose your thirst for knowledge. If you have a problem," he says, "there's a pretty good chance one of us has experienced that same challenge along the way."

Chaney Finally, Dr. expressed tremendous gratitude for being nominated and awarded NODA's most prestigious honor. He says, "I didn't get or stay involved in organized dentistry to win awards, but it is most certainly humbling to be acknowledged by your friends and peers in this manner. 

# Caring for the Homeless

**Ozanam Inn** recently honored the LSUHSC Schools of Dentistry and Medicine and Tulane School of Medicine for their weekly student-run clinics providing free medical

and dental care to the homeless and needy. At the 37th Annual Ozanam Inn Gala held in October, the deans of each of the three schools represented their students and faculty members who serve at the weekly clinics.

LSUHSC students see patients on Saturdays while Tulane students operate a clinic on Sundays. The medical program was already established when the dental school joined the effort five years ago. Under faculty supervision, students treat about 500 individuals a year.

Ozanam Inn, located at 843 Camp Street in downtown New Orleans, is

a non-profit, direct service agency serving the homeless and needy regardless of race, color, creed, religious preference, or national origin. All of its services are provided free of charge. The Inn was established in 1955 by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay service organization dedicated to helping the poor. While the Inn provides overnight shelter to males only, both men and women are eligible for the medical and dental care.

Providing dental care to the less fortunate citizens of New Orleans has become a habit for this dedicated group of LSUSD dental students and faculty members. Totally student-run and voluntary, the dental care is provided interprofessionally with LSUHSC medical students. Four dental students administer and manage the program. This year the administrators are third-year students Brooks Hummel, Jeffrey Toler, Mandy Ford, and John Michaelis. Supervising faculty members Sherrod (Shade) Quin, DDS, assistant professor, and Suezan McCormick, DMD, assistant professor, both in the Department of Comprehensive Dentistry and Biomaterials, Division of Clinical Comprehensive and Operative Dentistry, have been exceptionally dedicated to the project since its inception in 2013.

Every Saturday from 9:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m., six dental

students provide dental exams and extractions for six or seven patients at Ozanam Inn. LSUSD supplies materials and instruments for the care of these patients in one

> operatory with one dental chair. Students, who receive no academic credit for working at the Inn, are members of all four dental classes. First-year students assist while second year students administer anesthestics, but only after completion of their local anesthesia course. Thirdand fourth-year students extract teeth. A portable dental x-ray unit is an invaluable asset in the clinic.

A strong desire and commitment to serve the needy is required of students who participate in the program. The Ozanam Inn clinic provides handson training in managing

dental care of vulnerable patients in less than ideal situations. Although students coordinate all aspects of the program, it would not be possible without the constant dedication of Drs. Quin and McCormick, who show up every Saturday during the school year to supervise procedures.

LSUSD alumni Drs. Stacy (2017) and Reid Owens (2014) were active in launching the dental clinic at Ozanam Inn. The founding students recruited faculty members to supervise treatment at the clinic. Enthusiasm gradually increased among students in the first- and second-year classes until students in all four classes became committed to working at the Inn. Jenny Herman, one of the founding students, said, "The benefits of the learning experience at Ozanam Inn are equal to the satisfaction gained from helping the underserved." Drs. Hillary Wright and Jenny Herman, currently residents in periodontics, are proud of the continuing strength of the program they helped develop.

Ozanam Inn is one of the many beneficiaries of LSUSD student outreach activities. An early example of interprofessional education, it exhibited the benefits of medical and dental students working in the same clinic. As an example of a student-run volunteer clinic, this project clearly demonstrates LSUSD student determination to help the underserved and less fortunate among us.




