Bioterrorism

Surgeon general says dentists equal partners in facing the challenge

Washington—U.S. Surgeon General Richard H. Carmona, M.D., sees dentists as equal partners in the war on terrorism, he told dental leaders March 27 at a conference on “Dentistry’s Role in Responding to Bioterrorism and other Catastrophic Events.”

The conference was co-sponsored by the American Dental Association and the U.S. Public Health Service.

Dr. Carmona, a high-school dropout and Army enlistee who later retrieved his education, is the 17th Surgeon General of the USPHS, sworn into office last Aug. 5. He opened the two-day conference with an overview of the current threat that

invited dentist participation in the war on terrorism.

“I will consider dentistry an equal partner with all the other health professions at the table as we approach these challenges before us,” he said. “I will probably ask for your assistance and guidance. Let us know how you think you can best serve your country.”

Dentists at war

Editor’s note: Dr. Franklin is one of hundreds of U.S. dentists being deployed by the U.S. armed forces. This issue of the ADA News presents her story and that of other dentists in the service at home and abroad. As the war continues, the News will continue to bring you reports from dentists in uniform.

Killeen, Texas—“Hey, Doc, do you want to see a picture of my family?”

Dr. Lisa Franklin’s answer is always yes.

“I go to bed each night and think I want to remember every one of them,” explains the 39-year-old reserve captain about the soldiers she treats at Perkins Dental Clinic, Fort Hood, Texas.

Mobilized for the first time in January, she serves in a medical support unit, one of three types of dental units in the army. The MSU dentists’ mission is to make sure soldiers are dentally ready-to-go.

“I get to hear about it all,” explains Dr. Franklin. “Many of the men are leaving wives who are expecting and many of the women are engaged to be married. I see the hard-core types who’ve been through war before and the wide-eyed kids.

“But I haven’t treated anyone who isn’t eager to do what they’re trained to do and then come back

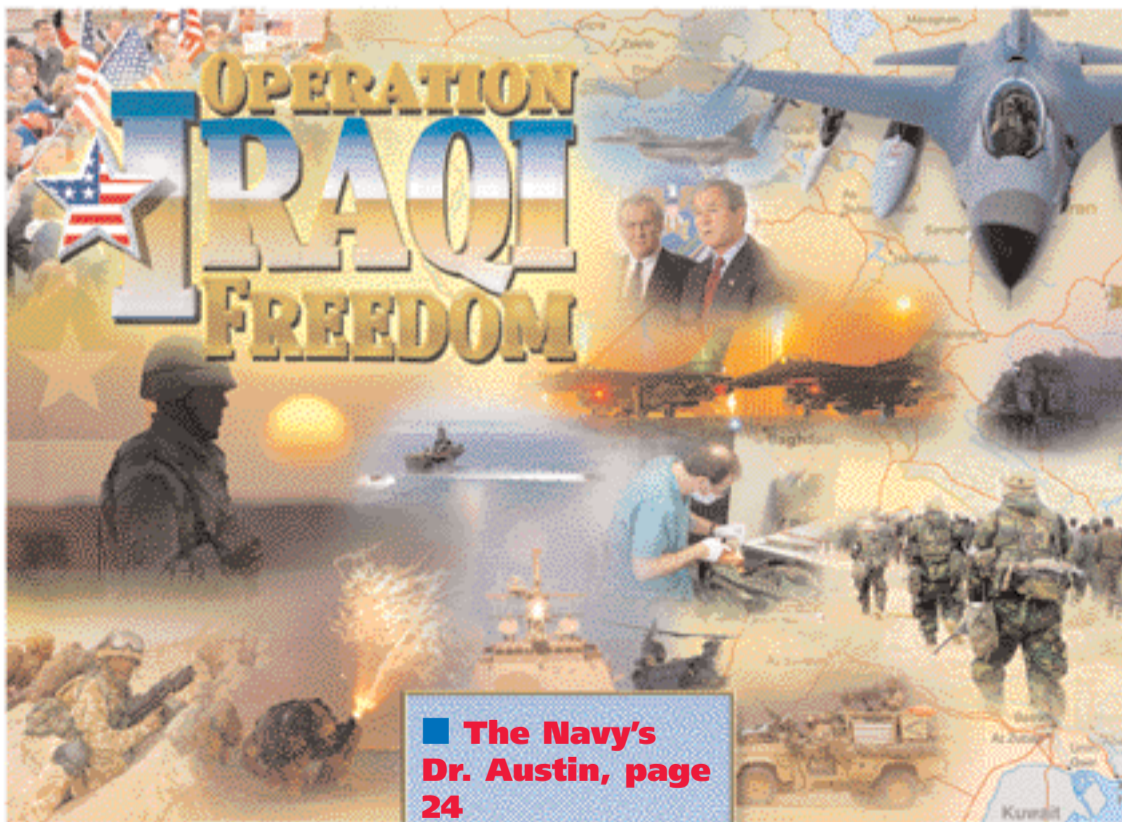

home to their families,” she says.

Dr. Franklin puts in longer hours since leaving her private practice in Corpus Christi more than two months ago; some days are 12 hours long. “The flow of patients just never stops,” she says. “There are always more soldiers to treat.”

She signed up for the reserves back

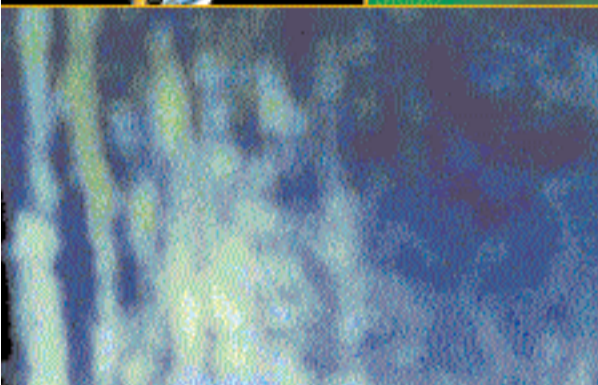

Dr. Samuel D. Harris, dental philanthropist, dies at 99

Gainesville, Fla.—Dr. Samuel D. Harris touched the lives of more than a million children during his lifetime and built a legacy that will reach youngsters for generations to come.

Dr. Harris, a leader in pediatric dentistry and distinguished dental philanthropist, died at his retirement home here Feb. 27, just eight weeks shy of his 100th birthday.

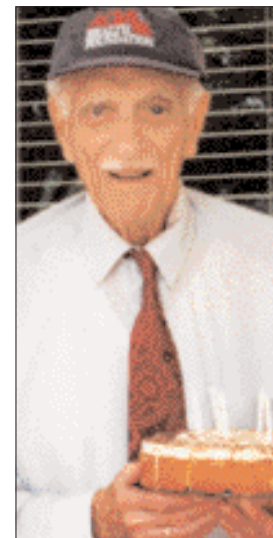
A larger-than-life personality and pioneer in the profession, Dr. Harris founded the first pediatric dental organizations in the nation. A gen-

erous philanthropist, he contributed millions of dollars to establish and support a national dental museum and to endow a grant program to support outstanding community and regional children's dental programs.

"Dr. Harris' vision was to help children and his generosity to the ADA Foundation was enormous," says Dr. James B. Bramson, ADA executive director and secretary of the ADA Foundation. "We cannot thank him and his family enough. To celebrate his upcoming 100th birthday, the ADA Board had all signed a big

card that we were going to present to him. We will miss him greatly, but his work will go on."

Mentors: A link to the real world

If you were lucky enough to have a mentor in dental school, you understand the important role he or she played in your education. Although mentors help bridge the gap between academic training and the “real world,” the relationship between mentor and student often goes much deeper. Mentors profoundly affect how their students approach the practice of dentistry.

The Oregon Dental Association recently sponsored the annual student/mentor dinner at Oregon Health and Science University. The dinner was a success and many dentists from our community have volunteered to mentor dental students. This will hopefully be the first of many meetings between dental students and their mentors.

The goal of the student mentor program is to initiate conversation between dental students and practicing dentists. The students have a chance to sit down, have dinner and ask questions. In listening to some of these conversations, I think they know more about what to ask than I did as a dental student.

I regret that I did not have a mentor when I went to school. Of course I had faculty dentists I could talk to about the clinical aspects of dentistry, but I wished I knew someone who had been “out there” to ask questions on issues such as overhead, staff management, dental materials and costs, staff management, tax deadlines and, of course, staff management. The list goes on.

Frankly, I don't think I knew enough to ask those questions. I didn't have to manage anyone but myself in school. I knew that clinic supplies came from “the cage” (as it was called then), and that if I ran out of impression material, I only had to go to the cage and ask for more. I had no idea it was so expensive. How would I?

I also thought “tax deadline” only meant April 15. Imagine my surprise when it came time to pay my first quarterly payroll taxes, unemployment taxes, Tri-Met taxes, property taxes and so on. No one prepared me. Being the first dentist in my family did not help either; I knew nothing about the practice of dentistry.

This is exactly why mentors are so important. If you are a mentor, ask probing questions and remind your student that there is no such thing as a “dumb” question. Take the initiative to call your student. Take them out to lunch or dinner. Students are often so bogged down with didactic and clinical subjects that they forget to relax and live a little. Be a lifeline for them.

Although dental school is a good start, there is nothing like talking to an actual dentist, someone who has business savvy as well as clinical experience.

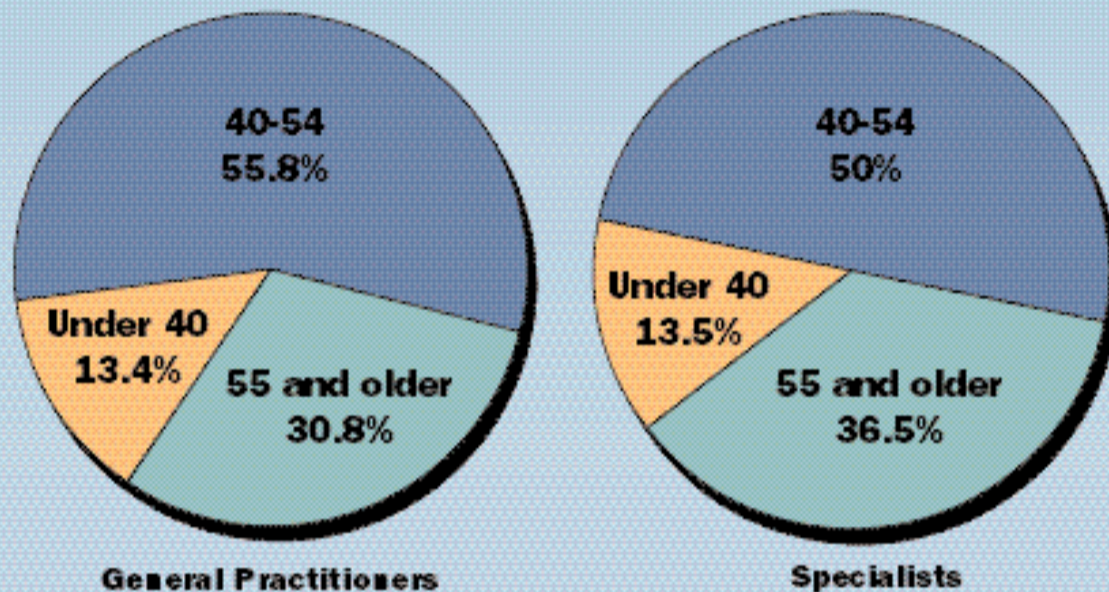

One must wonder, however, what happens to all those kids on the remaining 364 days of the year?

Editor's note: Dr. Yeager correctly points out why no charitable care effort—even one on the scale of Give Kids a Smile—will ever solve the problems of children or any other underserved groups, because charity isn't a health

care system. That was a key reason the ADA undertook Give Kids A Smile, to provide state dental associations and others who care about access issues with a highly visible platform—a massive, nationwide event—from which to call attention to the problems and advocate common-sense, market-based solutions. Based on the press coverage, dentists did an excellent job of getting the message out. The ADA also is encouraged by reports that many children seen on Feb. 21 were either referred to sources of continuing care or taken on as patients by dentists who treated them on that day.

Which system?

The My View piece by Dr. Peter Hampl ("Dental Lessons Learned from the WTC Dis-

aster," Feb. 17 ADA News) admonishes us to all use the universal-accepted numbering system to facilitate forensics among other things.

Does he mean the numbering system used in the rest of the world or the numbering system advocated by the ADA here in the United States? Since we've joined up with the FDI now it seems like a good time to drop our unique numbering and lettering system and go with the more widely accepted 11-85 numbering system.

Editor's note: Dr. Hampl responds: "I think it's time for the ADA and the educators to advocate one system and teach one system for tooth numbering. The simplest is 1-32, but I don't advocate a particular system as long as every-

body uses the same one." The ADA officially recognizes that the two major systems used for tooth designation are the Universal/National System used primarily in the United States and the International Standards Organization (ISO) TC 106 method used in most other countries.

Standardize numbering

As a general practitioner who also spent several gut-wrenching days down at the New York City morgue after the World Trade Center attack and the Flight 586 airline disaster, I will forever carry the memories of the gurneys with the black plastic bags lined up down the hall, each accompanied by a vigilant New York City cop; the respect afforded the mangled remains

 By the same token, remember that the mentor/student relationship is not entirely one-sided. While mentors may be ahead of their students in many ways, the students may also be ahead of the mentors in research. The volume of research in medicine and dentistry makes it hard for most of us to keep up once we get out of school. Your student is likely to be a very good source of information about new research and dental materials.

I believe the mentor program has tremendous potential, but it needs your help. This is not a matter of giving money (which I am sure you are tired of being asked about); it is about giving time. A phone call a month costs very little, but can reap huge benefits in terms of guiding future dental practitioners.

And those future practitioners might just give us a little guidance as well.

we found inside those bags; and the amazement and gratitude of the police and firefighters when they learned that there were dozens of unpaid dental volunteers who left their practices and their families to do what only a dentist can do: identify the victims and bring peace to their families.

Dr. Peter Hampl's observations about the variable quality of dental records received at the Medical Examiner's office are totally true.

However, since the majority of dental offices are now computerized, it occurs to me that perhaps the ADA can help. With minimal financial support from the ADA or perhaps from federal

Homeland Security sources, our Association could sponsor a cooperative effort between Dr. Jim McGivney, the gifted developer of the "WinID2" Forensic Dental Identification computer program and the major dental practice software designers.

If a standard format or even a set of conversion programs could be developed so that all future dental office practice management programs could easily and automatically feed their data seamlessly into WinID2, records would arrive at future disaster sites electronically—aiding in faster and better identification.

Please note that I have no financial interest whatsoever in any entity that might benefit from such a project. But I can think of nothing that would cost the ADA so little and benefit so many in so profound a manner than the devel-

opment of a standardized interface between WinID2 and the myriad of dental management programs. I urge the ADA House of Delegates to consider sponsoring such a project as soon as possible.

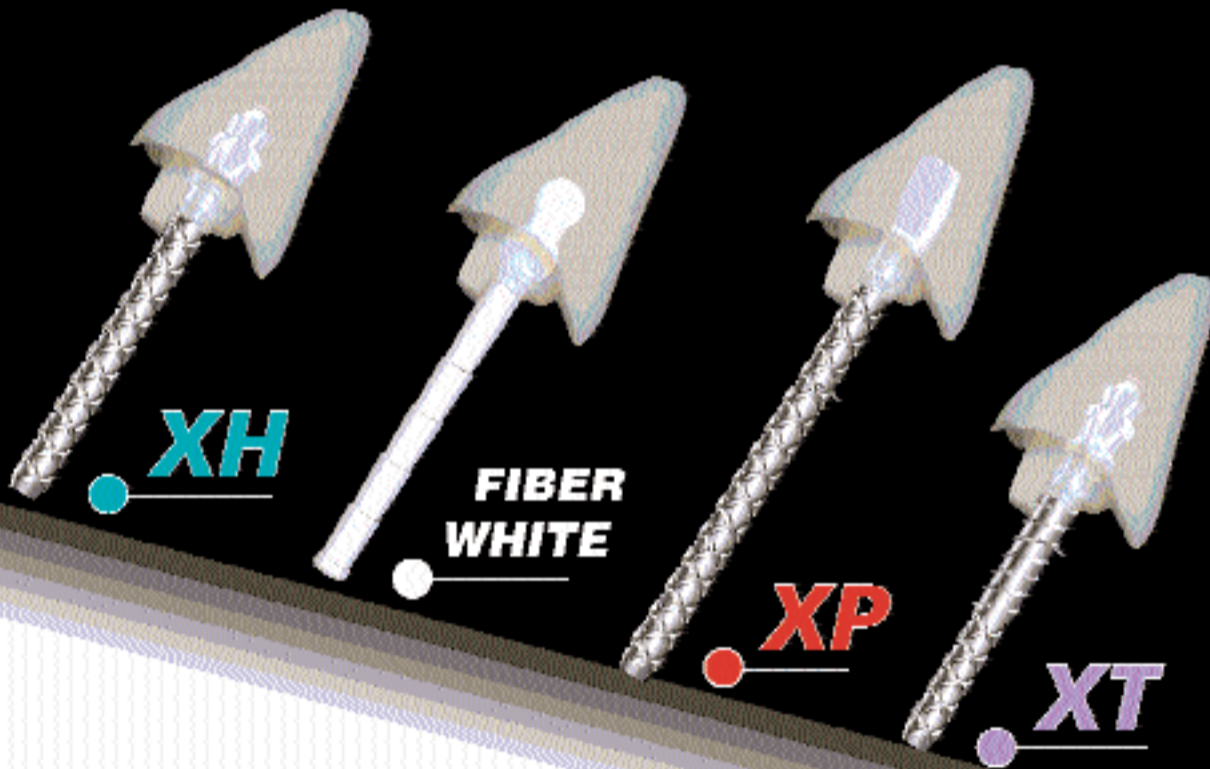
Editor's note: Dr. Mark Diehl, chair of the ADA work group on the Electronic Dental Record, responds: "About 15 years ago, in the mid 1980s, a number of forensic dental programs were being touted for human identification in mass casualty events. All typically used a computerized anti-mortem dental chart in a database—nearly all used some variant of the dBase (XBase) technology. The dental examin-

er recorded post-mortem chart details in the same system. These systems then did a record-by-record comparison of ante- and post-mortem data to provide a 'differential diagnosis' of possible identities. Since that time, public awareness and developer emphasis on this use of database technology had declined substantially ... until the WTC.

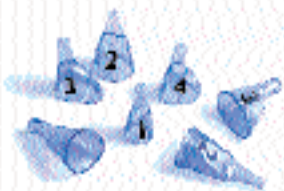
"The ANSI/ADA 1000 provides the data level infrastructure to rapidly create forensic dental identification software. It provides a standard data structure and since the developer does not need to scratch-build the database, development is more efficient and economical. U.S. House resolution lauds GKAS

Washington—Legislation introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives thanks the nation's dentists "for volunteering their time to help provide needed dental care" and congratulates the ADA for the Give Kids a Smile program. The ADA-sponsored dental access campaign was launched Feb. 21.

"Dentists provide an estimated \$1.7 billion annually in nonreimbursed dental care," declares House Resolution 136 introduced March 11 by Rep. Eric Cantor (R-Va.) and referred to the Energy and Commerce Committee. "Access to dental care for children is a vital element of overall health care and development."

This type of resolution when passed, as these resolutions generally are, expresses the sense of the House of Representatives.

The resolution must first receive committee approval. It would declare: "Resolved, that the House of Representatives:

- (1) congratulates the ADA for establishing 'Give Kids a Smile';
- (2) emphasizes the need to improve access to dental care for children; and
- (3) thanks the thousands of dentists who volunteered their time and brought a smile to faces of an estimated 1 million children on Feb. 21, 2003."

Ron Lewis (R-Ky.) is a co-sponsor. The ADA is preparing an "action alert" urging grassroots action teams of volunteer dentists to seek additional co-sponsors from their members of Congress.

ADA dentists "established the 'Give Kids a Smile' program to serve as a reminder to the nation about the need to end untreated childhood dental disease," says HRes 136. "The 'Give Kids a Smile' program treated an estimated one million children on Feb. 21, 2003, at approximately 5,000 locations in all 50 states." An ADA survey is under way to refine those figures and project other estimates such as the value of GKAS-delivered dental care.

Court dismisses suit

Atlanta—A state court judge signed a consent order March 21 to dismiss, without prejudice, 20 anti-amalgam lawsuits.

The order acknowledged the plaintiffs' attorney's request to withdraw the suits against the American Dental Association and the Georgia Dental Association.

"We are pleased that the plaintiffs' lawyer has decided to withdraw all of the amalgam lawsuits in the state court in Georgia regarding both the Georgia Dental Association and the American Dental Association," says Peter M. Sfikas, chief counsel for the Association.

Adds ADA President T. Howard Jones, "We're glad for this outcome. The Association is contin-

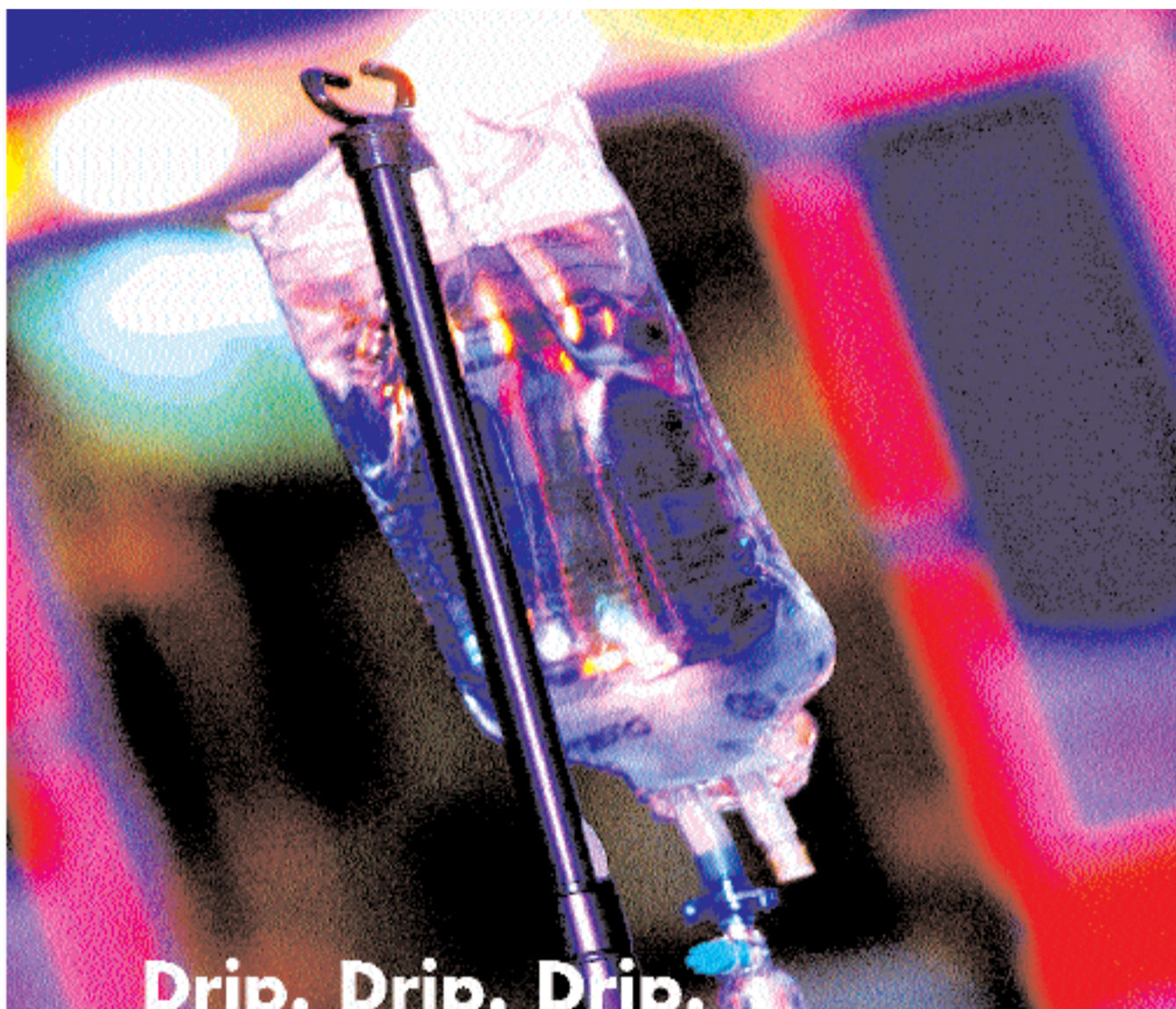
uing its efforts to affirm its position that restorative materials, including dental amalgam, are safe materials based on sound science so that dentists and patients will continue to have a choice of restoratives."

The ADA consented to Judge Susan Forsling's voluntary dismissal of the suits after the GDA was similarly dismissed the preceding week.

Plaintiffs alleged the ADA and GDA had passed ethical codes that prevented dentists from discussing the purported "toxicity" of amalgam fillings. Anti-amalgamists also complained the ADA and GDA had breached a duty to warn dental patients of the particular risks of amalgam, and had coerced amalgam manufacturers to not provide such warnings.

The dismissal comes on the heels of two similar Georgia lawsuits one month earlier wherein a federal judge for the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia granted Feb. 24 the ADA's motion to dismiss "for lack of personal jurisdiction."

A week earlier, New York Supreme Court Judge William Roy dismissed two amalgam lawsuits in favor of defendants the ADA, New York State Dental Association and 5th District Dental Society. Judge Roy granted Feb. 18 dentistry's motion to dismiss on grounds that the anti-amalgamists had failed to state a claim for which relief could be granted. ■

Anti-amalgam groups now switch tactics

Despite vindication in the courts over the safety of dental amalgam, the ADA and tripartite dental societies still face more work ahead.

With more and more anti-amalgam lawsuits being thrown out or otherwise judged in favor of use of the dental restorative material, anti-amalgamists appear to be switching tactics. Their latest target: state lawmakers.

"Opponents of dental amalgam have not been successful in raising concerns about the safety of amalgam as a restorative material, so they appear to have changed their strategy and are attempting legislation that will make it more difficult for dentists to continue using amalgam," says Cathy Mudge of the California Dental Association.

"We are seeing across the country a number of disingenuous state bills—oftentimes unbeknownst to the legislative authors."

Adds Rick Murray, executive director of the Arizona Dental Association, "The anti-amalgamists are very clever in their tactic to blur the line between amalgam and mercury. They use amalgam as a synonym for mercury—which is totally false—but what we are seeing happening is that lawmakers who are uneducated about the subject start to believe that amalgam and mercury are one and the same."

To combat the misinformation, the ADA and state dental associations are working tirelessly to educate legislators that treatment decisions must be made by a patient and the dentist, based on the unique needs of that individual and sound scientific information—and the tripartite's efforts are starting to pay off.

"A number of the proposed state bills have not garnered enough support to be enacted into law," notes ADA President T. Howard Jones.

"Nonetheless, dental societies must be vigilant in identifying these measures and in working to guarantee that treatment decisions are made by patients and their dentists—not someone else's political agenda." ■

The ADA is now issuing an official call for applications for the ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership. Dentists who wish to apply to participate in the inaugural class should submit application materials by May 12.

Approved in 2002 by the ADA House of Delegates, the

ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership is a three-part personal leadership training program designed to enhance the leadership skills of dentists who belong to racial, ethnic and/or gender

backgrounds that have been traditionally under-represented in leadership roles.

"Enthusiastic, dynamic people who are looking for more tools to become a strong leader" would benefit from participating in the Institute, said Dr. Kathleen Roth, 9th District Trustee and a member of the ADA Board of Trustees' standing committee on diversity.

The curriculum will help participants acquire the leadership skills necessary to help them make a positive impact in their communities, dental

associations or the profession.

"The ideal candidate is someone at least five years out of dental school, someone who is active in their community, perhaps their dental association or church, but certainly someone who has great potential to be a leader," added Dr. Roth.

To be considered for participation, candidates should also:

- be active licensed dentists in practice for a minimum of five years;
- demonstrate promise as a leader, but have not held any significant leadership role in organized dentistry;
- be able to commit the time necessary to successfully complete the program.

Dr. Roth emphasized that participation is not limited to those active in organized dentistry, nor is it intended that all Institute participants use the training to become active leaders in the American Dental Association.

Rather, the goal of the ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership is to provide leadership training for a diverse group of dentists who will use the principles of training to take a leadership role in affecting positive change in their communities or the dental profession.

Participants are required to attend three two-day leadership training workshops that take place at ADA Headquarters Sept. 4-5 and Dec. 8-9. The third session is Sept. 9-10, 2004.

Sessions will be led by faculty from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University, one of the nation's top-ranked business schools.

Participants will also complete a self-selected personal leadership project that provides dentists with hands-on experience with identifying and taking action on a civic or professional issue that is important to them. For guidance in completing the leadership project, participants will have access to faculty at the Kellogg School and mentors from the dental profession.

There is no tuition for the ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership, and dentists chosen to participate will receive a stipend to offset travel and related expenses.

An advisory panel of representatives from national dental organizations and leaders with unique expertise on diversity issues worked with the Association to develop the ADA Institute for Diversity in Leadership.

Dental leaders review roles in bioterrorism

Washington—Dentists could be asked to help their communities respond to bioterrorism, the American Dental Association said.

The ADA and U.S. Public Health Service jointly sponsored a landmark conference March 27-28 on "Dentistry's Role in Responding to Bioterrorism and Other Catastrophic Events," attracting more than 300 private practice and public health dentists, dental educators, military dental officers, dental researchers and team members including hygienists and assistants.

One objective of the two-day meeting was to brief the profession on potential new roles for dentists in biodefense to complement more traditional and essentially forensic roles of dentists in disaster response. The program spoke to both the new and the traditional and to partnering in response to what the U.S. Surgeon General said are the "inevitable threats" of terrorism. (See related story, page one.)

"It is likely that dentistry could be called on to provide assistance in the immediate aftermath of a significant bioterrorism attack, especially when the traditional medical capabilities in a community have been overwhelmed," the Association's top elected and staff officers said in a "Dear Colleague" letter to conference attendees.

"The ADA has developed a strategy to inform

dentists of the potential role they may play in the response to a significant bioterrorism attack and to help prepare the profession to respond," said the letter signed by ADA President T. Howard Jones and Executive Director James B. Bramson.

The ADA leaders "strongly recommend" in the letter that dentists develop a special "bioterrorism" file for the dental office, and they promised that additional educational materials will be provided by the Association.

"In addition to helping to prepare you and your staff for assisting in your community, the information in this special file will help you protect yourself, your family, your staff and patients in the event of a bioterrorism attack," they said.

Smallpox, a serious, contagious and sometimes fatal infectious disease, is one concern, said the ADA letter. The Association in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention offered information on the disease eradicated worldwide but feared as a potential agent of bioterrorism. The CDC has lead responsibility in a national smallpox vaccination campaign under way in response to this threat.

"We are certain that you are aware of the national concern about the potential for bioterrorism attacks on our people and the use of smallpox as a weapon in those attacks," Drs. Jones and Bramson said in the "Dear Colleague" letter.

"Should the threat of a smallpox attack become a reality, dentists may become involved in surveillance efforts to detect and help monitor the spread of the disease. Dentists may also be asked to assist in providing vaccinations against smallpox. The enclosed material will be very useful in giving dentists information they will

need to assist them with detection and in providing those services."

The ADA-CDC packet of materials includes information about the disease, the vaccine and the CDC smallpox Web site ("www.bt.cdc.gov/agent/smallpox/index.asp"). "Ensuring that clinicians have the right information about smallpox and other potential terrorism agents is critical as we work toward improving this nation's pre-

paredness for a terrorism attack," said CDC Director Julie Gerberding, M.D.

Summaries of conference proceedings will be prepared and distributed to registrants, conference organizers said. ■

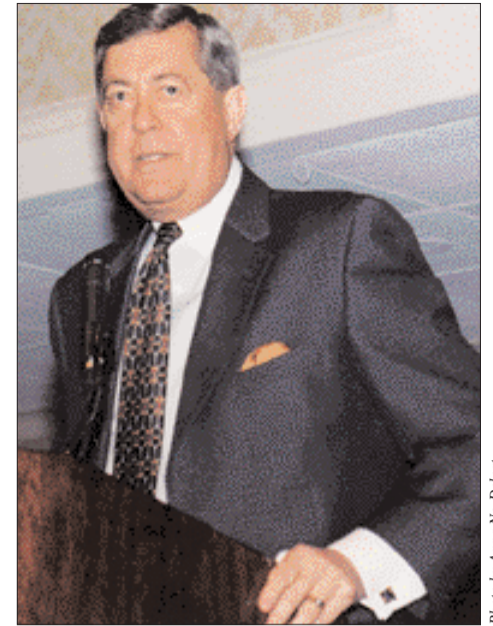



More than 300 registrants, almost all of them dentists, welcomed the surgeon general to a dialogue aimed at shaping a strategy for professional service in the war on terrorism. Summaries of conference presentations will be prepared and distributed to attendees.

"We have a reason to be here," ADA President T. Howard Jones said in opening the conference. "We want you to leave with some clarity about your role for something we hope we will never need."

A partnership theme quickly emerged, initiated by Surgeon General Carmona's vision of a war "still very alien to most people" and enlisting health professionals, including dentists, in new and ongoing roles.

"Who would have ever thought there'd be such a huge demand for forensic dentistry?" he said, referring to the terrorist attacks of Sept. 11, 2001, and the lead role of forensic dentists in identification. "It's really terrible but that's the world we live in. Who would have ever thought we'd be dealing with germs as weapons, planes as weapons?"

"What if we have to immunize a lot of people because of an impending threat," said Surgeon General Carmona. "Could not dentists be involved? Could not dentists be involved in taking histories, screening patients, dealing with outpatient issues? Absolutely. I think we're only on the very brink of how much dentistry can be involved as a response force as part of our partnership and team as we prepare our country for these inevitable threats."

Other speakers also cited a potential role for dentists in administering vaccines if necessary. Dr. Michael C. Alfano, dean of the New York University College of Dentistry, announced a "handshake agreement" reached earlier in the week with the New York City health commissioner under which dentists would join mass inoculation teams formed in the event of a smallpox attack.

The dental school is preparing training modules for courses to be offered online at the school's Web site, he said. The first of four modules is finished and a second is nearly ready. As many as 2,000 dentists and dental students could be trained and available to administer vaccines if necessary,

Emerging from a 14-day coma unable to walk or talk, she battled through intensive and lengthy rehabilitation, went to medical school and is now a neuropathologist and a mom, he proudly told the group and Dr. Fauci.

Dr. Alfano said. "We want to get dentists trained now."

Rep. John Linder (R-Ga.), one of three dentists in the U.S. House of Representatives, said the three dentist lawmakers serve with the House physician as a voluntary group available for triage for any tragedy occurring in the U.S. Capitol complex.

"The most important thing you have as a pro-

fession is a longtime personal commitment to your communities," he said. "This is a different world than it was when I came to Congress, and it will never be the same again. There are roles in this effort to secure our homeland for every one of us, and there are unique roles for dentistry."

Reps. Charlie Norwood (R-Ga.) and Mike Simpson (R-Idaho) are the other dentists in Congress. ■

Washington—Why not a survival kit for the dental office? Dr. Michael Monica of Edison, N.J., asked during a tabletop discussion of recent public advisories on protecting the home in a terrorist attack.

"That's a good idea; I'll look into that," said Dr. Lee Shackelford, on assignment with the U.S. Public Health Service in Shiprock, N.M.

Two dentists, one in private practice and one in public health, found common ground on dental office protections while attending the first-ever March 27-28 conference on

"Dentistry's Role in Responding to Bioterrorism and Other Catastrophic Events."

Hal Muller of Henry Schein Inc., wasn't at the table at the time but extended the dialogue from the speaker's podium by suggesting a list of survival kit supplies "you might want to get now; don't call your supplier the day of an event."

Other speakers expanded the discussion to include evacuation and shelter-in-place contingencies, "survival strategies," for the private practice, dental schools and clinics.

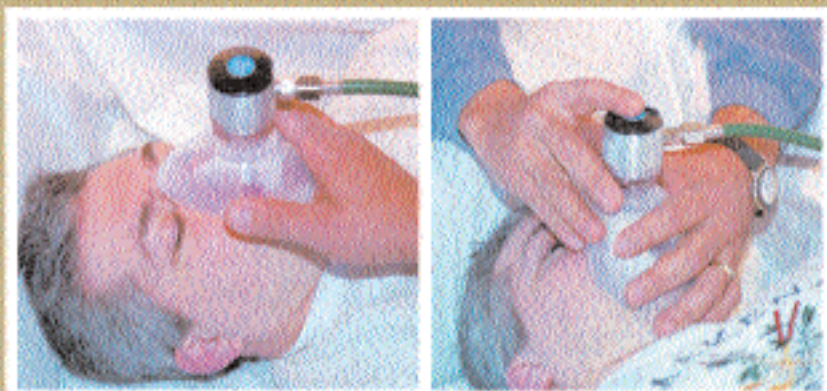
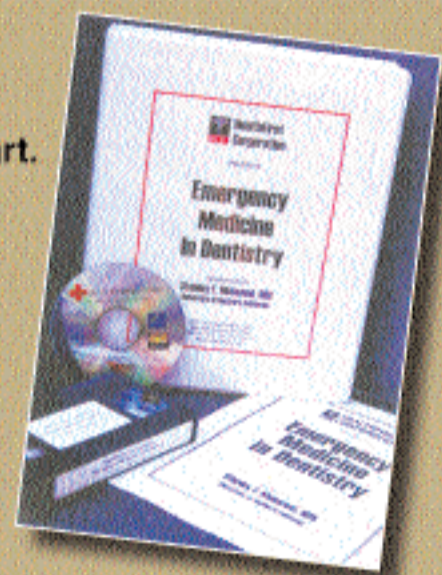

Dentistry grants program, established in 1999, has provided 96 grants totaling \$393,346 to date.

"Dr. Harris, through his tireless efforts in organized dentistry and as a philanthropist, improved oral health care for children," says Dr. Anthony R. Volpe, Foundation president. "The many charitable programs established through his vision, leadership and generous support will continue to provide resources, training and inspiration for programs addressing the oral health needs of children, especially those who are at greatest risk."

Thanks to a generous grant from Dr. Harris, the ADA also established the Samuel D. Harris National Children's Dental Health Month State Program awards to promote excellence in NCDHM activities at the state level. These awards are presented each year with the intent that they be used to provide further statewide coordination of NCDHM programs.

"He was so dedicated to helping children," says Dr. Jack Gottschalk, a close friend of Dr. Harris for four decades, "that he hoped that somehow, some way, his efforts could help bring dentistry to every child."

Dr. Gottschalk, chair emeritus of the Dr. Samuel D. Harris National Museum of Dentistry Board of Visitors in Baltimore, says Dr. Harris' "eyes sparkled when he heard a good idea and his love of dentistry was contagious. I can't help but smile as I talk about him."

Dr. Harris donated his resources through endowments, adds Dr. Gottschalk, to help ensure that his gifts could be used to help children forever, not just for a limited time.

He felt strongly that this was his opportunity to give back to the profession," he said. "He was so honored to be a dentist and an ADA member,

and he wanted to give something back that could make a lasting impact on children's dental health."

"He was so kind, so open," says Rosemary Fetter, executive director of the dental museum.

Dr. Harris' enthusiasm for the work of the interactive museum showed in a video produced in honor of its fifth anniversary, Ms. Fetter adds.

"There's a clip of Dr. Harris speaking to someone who hadn't seen the museum yet and he tells the person, 'Oh, you're gonna love it!' His warm personality would really shine through when he spoke with you."

Dr. John G. Harris, Dr. Harris' son and an orthodontist in Port Huron, Mich., remembers his father not only as a tremendous clinician, leader and philanthropist, but as a dynamic speaker as well.

"When I was a kid, I remember attending a father-son function at school and every father was supposed to address the group," he says. "He was one of the first fathers to speak, and after he was finished, the next father stood up and said, 'I've got to follow that?'"

The younger Dr. Harris says he always wanted to be an orthodontist, thanks to his father's influence.

"I never thought about doing anything else," he says. "It was what I saw my dad doing and I was very interested in orthodontics."

After 54 years of dental practice, Dr. Harris retired and embraced his role as a philanthropist, said Ms. Fetter, "with a firm handshake that could actually hurt your hand."

Dr. Harris continued to seek new challenges and interests when many individuals his age were slowing down, remembers his son. At age 65, he learned to play racquetball and remained vital and active throughout his life.

Dr. Harris was born in 1903 in the Ukraine. His family immigrated to Canada in 1904 and to the United States in 1910. He graduated from

the University of Michigan School of Dentistry in 1924. From 1924-25, he was on the staff of the Forsyth Dental Infirmary for Children in Boston. In 1925, he opened a private practice in Detroit specializing in pediatric dentistry with emphasis on orthodontics.

In 1927, he founded the American Society of Dentistry for Children and later helped establish the Academy and the College of Pediatric Dentistry. He initiated and helped organize 18 national societies and the International Association of Pediatric Dentistry. He was elected a Fellow of the American College of Dentists in 1935.

He was a lifetime member of the International Association of Dentistry for Children, the American Society of Dentistry for Children, the ADA, the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, and the British Pedodontic Society. He received the University of Michigan Distinguished Service Award; a Distinguished Service Medallion from the American College of Dentists; and was chosen as the first Honorary Fellow of the American Fund for Dental Health.

There will be no funeral services for Dr. Harris. His family, says his son, will gather on April 23, what would have been Dr. Harris' 100th birthday.

"We'll all get together for his 100th birthday celebration," says Dr. John Harris, "and I think my father will be there in spirit."

WHO, CDC Webcast covers SARS outbreak

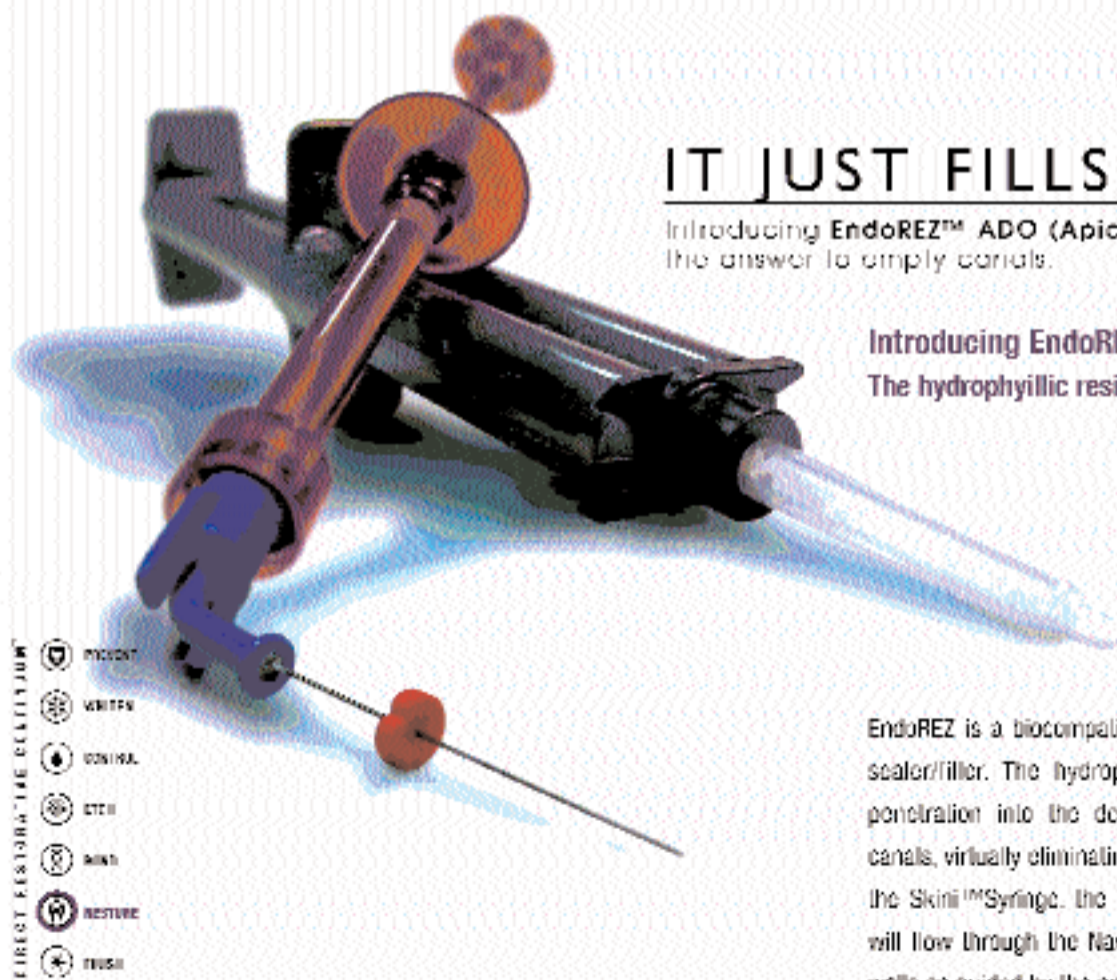
A global Webcast on severe acute respiratory syndrome was scheduled April 4 for viewing online at "www.phppo.cdc.gov/PHTN/webcast/sars".

Sponsored by the World Health Organization and supported by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Webcast was broadcast live on the Web and by satellite on April 4 to provide public health and clinical communities with basic information on the outbreak of the illness and guidance to prevent transmission.

Experts from CDC, WHO and several affected countries were scheduled at press time to speak on the program about the current outbreak of SARS, including strategies to prevent transmission in hospitals and other health care facilities and the need for international cooperation to stop the spread of SARS.

To date, some 1,600 SARS cases have been reported worldwide, resulting in at least 63 deaths, the Associated Press reported April 1. Dr. Carlo Urbani, the physician who first identified SARS in a Hanoi, Vietnam, hospital, is among those who have died from the disease, WHO announced March 29.

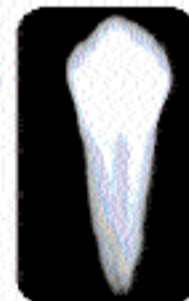

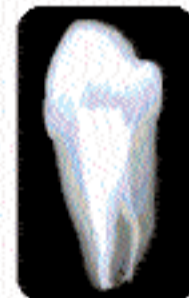

No retirement yet for Navy reservist

Carrollton, Ga.—Dr. Gordon Austin had been planning retirement from a long and “adventurous” military career, but Sept. 11, 2001, changed all that. Then came the March 6 call to war.

In a very real way, Dr. Austin has been there and done that, permitting his description of “adventurous” and offering a look at one dentist’s disengagement from small town America civilian practice for wartime duty. Make no mistake, Dr. Austin proudly sees it as the right thing to do while conceding the family and professional turmoil involved. This is his story.

“I began my Navy career with a health professionals scholarship during dental school at the Medical College in Georgia. My parents had three other children in college so the scholarship made dental school financially possible. My initial duty station was Guam, followed by an oral surgery fellowship at Parris Island (Marine Corps base) and an oral and maxillofacial surgery residency at the Naval Hospital in San Diego.

“After completing the residency, I was assigned with the Marines on Okinawa. My wife and daughter joined me for my next assignment at the Naval Hospital Subic Bay Philippines. During this tour, my wife was pregnant with our second daughter and I was back in Chicago taking oral surgery boards when the (1986) Philippine Revolution occurred.

“With two young children, we decided to make life less adventurous. I left active duty after 11 years for civilian practice but stayed in the reserves. I was just getting a solo practice started when recalled in support of Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm (1990-91), for-



unately a recall of short duration.

“As a senior captain, I was eligible for retirement and planning for it when we were attacked on 9/11 and I decided to do something more to repay what dentistry, the Navy and this nation had provided for me and my family. I had seen my friend (Rep.) Charlie Norwood (R-Ga.) quit his practice for election to Congress. My tennis partner, Howard Jones, made the commitment to serve as ADA president.

“I found my opportunity serving as national dental surgeon for the Reserve Officer Association. Continuing as a reserve dentist, I was assigned in February 2002 to the USS Theodore Roosevelt, an aircraft carrier in the Persian Gulf, as we conducted war in Afghanistan. On March 6, 2003, I received a phone call notifying me of my official recall to active duty.”

Deployment numbers change almost daily and there is no fix on the number of reserve force dentists recalled to active duty.

For Dr. Austin, as for other private practice general dentists and specialists, activation raises questions and issues about disengaging from practice. The issues vary by practice and location and no one process fits all practices. This is

how Dr. Austin described an evolving process.

“My orders were to report March 12 ‘for a period of 365 days, unless sooner released for a total of up to 24 months.’ This is the legal limit under the presidential order. Some will serve this long, most for a shorter period based on need. The specific need here is for an oral and maxillofacial surgeon filling in for active duty surgeons ordered from stateside hospitals to the hospital ship Comfort (now in the Persian Gulf).

“I will report to the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Md., to assure adequate staffing for the residency program and to provide continuity of care.

“The first thing is to establish a report date. I’m a solo practitioner in a small town, the only full-time oral and maxillofacial surgeon in town and the only oral surgeon on staff at three area hospitals. I requested a short delay in reporting to facilitate this process and took a military leave of absence from the hospitals. I called the oral surgeons in neighboring towns and they offered to support my practice by seeing post-operative patients or even coming to my office if necessary.

“My initial plan is to put the office on hold the first 30 days. I will keep the office open with staff answering phones, making arrangements for patients and reviewing charts and other office tasks put off during busy times. I will try to get back during the month and maybe work some weekends. Of course, this will depend on the demands of my Navy assignment.

“If mobilization continues for a longer period, I will reassess my options. I am certain even President Bush does not know how long this will take.

“My wife is a ‘battle-tested’ Navy wife and knows as I do that our six employees are an important concern if this turns out to be a longer war and a longer assignment. My older daughter is studying in Australia and has to explain to her Australian friends why Americans see Saddam as a threat to our national security. My younger daughter, who just turned 17, has become her school’s resource for information about the crisis.

“My friends and neighbors fly the flag proudly and have promised their support to my family in my absence. I believe this is the right thing to do, and I know my sacrifices are small compared to the sacrifices of many other reservists and their families. It is time to put aside our individual desires and pull together for our great nation.” ■

All set for deployment

Ike Skelton Training Site, Mo.—In the waning days of the Vietnam War, U.S. Army Reserve 2nd Lt. Don Fuchs would change to civilian clothing before going out in public.

“Because of anti-war sentiments in the mid-1970s, we didn’t wear our uniforms off base, even when I became captain on active duty,” he recalls.

The difference between then and Operation Iraqi Freedom is evident whenever Dr. Fuchs wears his BDUs (battle dress uniform).

“Now, I walk into a restaurant, people stop me and say, ‘We appreciate what you’re doing to make the country a safe place.’ I go to a convenience store, and someone will put coins on the register and say, ‘Can I buy that coffee for you?’”

Dr. Fuchs is a practicing general dentist, the drummer in a blues band and a keen researcher studying a possible link between the pediatric use of amoxicillin and mottled enamel in adolescents. But now, his focus is the Medical Command of the Missouri Army National Guard.

“My position is deputy commander for the Guard—but once mobilized, we are no longer in the Guard but part of the U.S. Army,” he clarifies. “Being put on alert is usually the first notice that a unit is going to be called to action. So we are to put our lives in order at this time.”

Dr. Fuchs commands a team of dentists, physicians and allied health workers whose job is to ensure medical readiness, “to make sure

soldiers don’t have medical conditions that would cause a problem for them or their units if they are deployed—because obviously a sick soldier is a liability to his unit,” he says.

“We do physicals, eyeglass prescriptions, all their immunizations: hepatitis, tetanus, yellow fever, smallpox, anthrax. Soldiers must be a Class I dental condition—no problems at all, or treated so as to reach Class II—no dental problems that could cause them pain or force them to seek attention over the next year of deployment.”

Another stark difference permeates all who walk the military base, and words aren’t necessary to distinguish check ups from screenings.

“People know, when we’re checking them out at ‘beltlines,’ this is not just an annual physical, this is a pre-deployment screening,” says Dr. Fuchs. Beltlines, he explains, are the soldier’s personal and military affairs. “Our personnel look at the soldiers’ dog tags, records, if I.D. cards are current, whether a personal will has been made out—check that all are in order.”

Due to his responsibility of getting U.S. troops ready to deploy, Dr. Fuchs doesn’t think he himself will be sent overseas at the moment. But if he is told to board the bus, he feels ready.

“I’ve talked with six dentists who will cover for me if I’m gone out of the country,” he says. “And though some people might use a medical excuse to get out of deployment, I have seen quite the contrary. Most soldiers literally beg me to deploy them because they’re so dedicated.

“I haven’t seen many slackers, that’s for sure.” ■

View from the Air Force

San Antonio—It was a Friday afternoon in late March and Lt. Col. David B. Powers had the day off to stay home with his wife and 3-year-old daughter.

“I want to spend as much time with them as I can,” said Lt. Col. Powers, an oral and maxillofacial surgeon, Air Force dental officer and member of the 59th Dental Squadron at Lackland Air Force Base.

Any day now, Dr. Powers is being deployed to the Middle East. He won’t know where and when until he gets the call, and he said the timing changes all the time.

No reservists from the 59th have been called to active duty, but Lt. Col. Powers knows of several dental officers who have been deployed overseas.

“I don’t think anyone would be excited about going to war,” Dr. Powers said of his deployment. “But when you make a decision to be in the military, this is part of it. If I am required to go and if I can provide care and comfort for our troops in the field, then it’s all worth it.” ■

in May of 2000. Out of dental school for 10 years at the time, she decided the reserves offered a great opportunity to do dentistry without taking too much time away from her private practice.

Since signing up, she's spent one weekend each month at Fort Sam Houston in San Antonio and two weeks each summer at Fort Hood, both practicing dentistry and learning soldiering skills, such as how to manage weapons and carry people on a stretcher.

Now she's deeply immersed in what she describes as "one of the highlights" of her life, despite what she describes as some of the uncertainties.

"It's scary to walk away from a business you've committed yourself to," she explains in talking about her practice. "And I feel a little guilty about abandoning my staff."

The "heads-up" that her unit—7210MSU—would be mobilized came last December. The official news quickly followed on Jan. 9. She had about nine days official notice before setting up shop at Fort Hood on Jan. 21.

"I thought my orders would be for 30 to 60 days and I prepared for three to six months," she explains. (She received the standard one-year deployment orders, subject to a new rotation policy that will significantly reduce the mobilization period.)

She describes herself as "not very organized," then goes on to outline detailed preparations

made immediately after signing up with the reserves back in 2000. They included reducing spending, managing debt, delegating more responsibilities to staff and requesting area dentists to fill-in, just in case she got called into service.

"The lines of communication [with other dentists] were opened by my participation in organized dentistry," says Dr. Franklin. "Partly because of that connection, I didn't feel uncomfortable about contacting my colleagues."

When rumblings about conflict in Iraq surfaced last summer, she brought in a 25-year dental assistant veteran with practice management experience to further prepare her staff.

"I did everything I knew to train my staff on how to make good judgment calls, how to prepare for my absence," she says.

Her planning is paying off. Two dentists, three hygienists and two of her office staff are keeping the practice up and running while she's away. A few of them won't even accept payment.

"They're the reason I'm able to do this—to serve my country," says Dr. Franklin about her staff and the doctors and hygienists filling in for her. "A few of them say it's their way of performing their patriotic duty."

Dr. Cheryl Rhoden uses her day off to treat patients at Dr. Franklin's office. The money she generates goes back into Dr. Franklin's practice.

"I was interested in helping someone who was serving our country," explains Dr. Rhoden. "I wanted to support our troops and Dr. Franklin in her efforts. In this way I feel like I'm doing my patriotic duty."

Dr. Rhoden says she knows the spirit of help-



ing is out there, "but many dentists may not know other dentists need their help."

She recommends that local dental societies make members aware of who is in the reserves and put together a list of people who might be willing to help their colleagues called to serve.

"A lot of people want to do their part, says Dr. Franklin. "We grow up singing patriotic songs and learning war stories. Now, I couldn't be prouder to treat the men and women who are going overseas."

Dr. Franklin says dentists interested in serving in the reserves should go to an Army post, walk through the dental clinic, get an opportunity to look around and experience military dentistry. ■

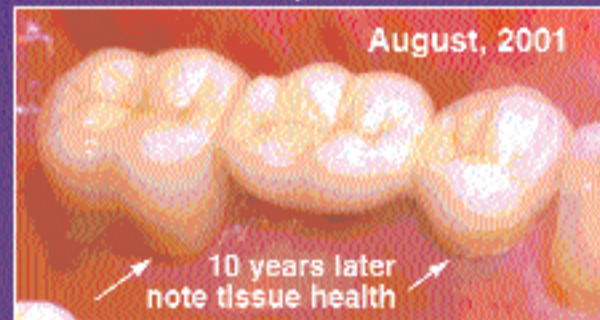

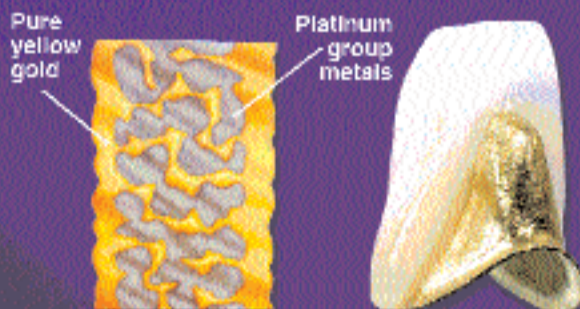

Mike Rogers (R-Mich.), national Republican congressional committee finance chair; Rep. David Scott (D-Ga.); Rep. Mike Thompson (D-Calif.), Democratic congressional campaign committee business council chair; and Rep. Fred Upton (R-Mich.).

Each had words of appreciation for dentists as political activists, community leaders and professionals, and they didn’t hesitate to sin-

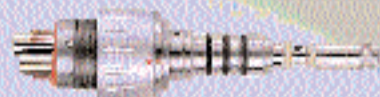
