

Residents of Katrina-Devastated New Orleans Received Free Dental Care

Dentists, hygienists, assistants, office staff, lab technicians and many other volunteers were on a mission, a Mission of Mercy (MOM) to provide free dental care to residents of New Orleans. Following in the example of the MOM Projects held by the Virginia, Kansas and Texas Dental Associations and the Open Door Clinic of Alamance County (NC), Remote Area Medical (RAM) of Knoxville, Tennessee organized a seven day health clinic in hurricane-ravaged New Orleans. Dental and medical services were provided free of charge to all those who sought assistance. The event was held at the New Orleans Audubon Zoo fromFebruary 6-12, 2006.


The dental clinic included 50 chairs and provided a range of free services from fillings and extractions to cleanings. Over 3,000 patients could be seen by dental volunteers. Those seen included Medicaid enrollees, uninsured, underinsured and temporary residents who are helping to rebuild New Orleans. The MOM Project will fill a void in access to dental care that is a result of the damage to offices and other medical facilities in and around the city.

Since its inception in 2000 in Virginia, the Mission of Mercy Projects strive to provide free dental care to people in desperate need. It is estimated that nearly 150 dental volunteers from across the country travelled to New Orleans to join dental volunteers from the Louisiana Dental Association to staff the clinic. The LSU School of Dentistry was a major partner in this effort and vows to be back in New Orleans to help support the healthcare needs of this ravaged city. The school's clinic has relocate to Baton Rouge until the facilities in New Orleans can be rebuilt. A 6-chair clinic is currently staffed in the Convention Center to address the immediate dental needs of the citizens of New Orleans.
