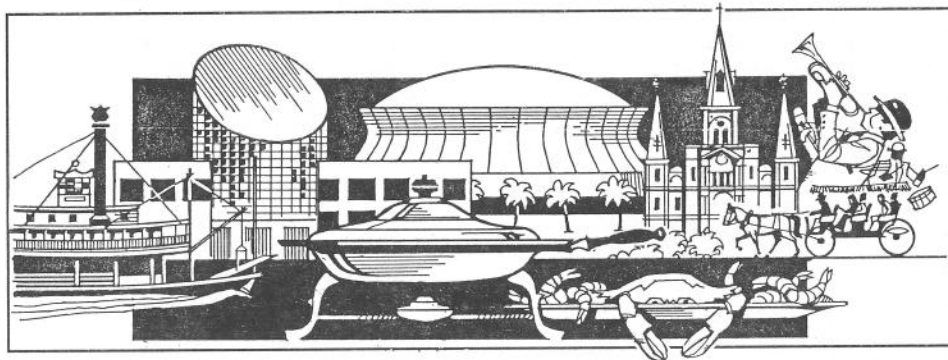

Sports note:

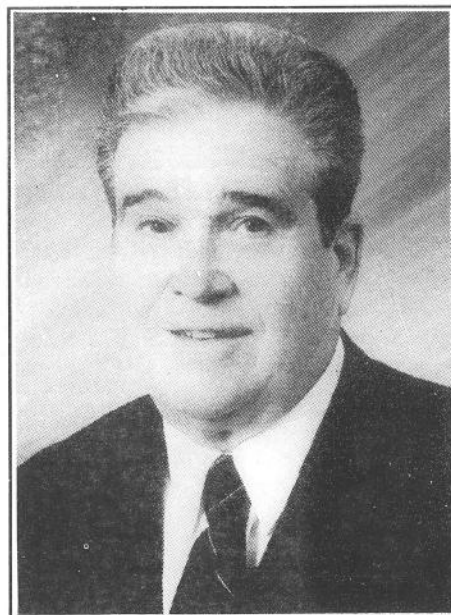
Tulane's Green Wave will play a football game against the University of Cincinnati Bearcats Saturday at the Louisiana Superdome, starting at 5 p.m.



Do you use the Internet?

Extracting Dental Information from the Internet, a lecture-seminar will be held Tuesday, October 24 from 6:30-8:30 p.m., in the LSUSD Library Conference Room. Tuition is \$25.

Dentists need to keep up with the literature for patient care, practice management, and research. With the availability of home computers and the Internet, health care professionals are often able to find professional information online without the assistance of librarians.

PubMed, a free gateway to MEDLINE from the National Library of Medicine, is a convenient tool for dentists who want to do their own literature searches via the Internet.

Although PubMed is user-friendly, training in the many features of this powerful search system will enable dentists to enhance the effectiveness of their searches.

Other databases and services from NLM will be reviewed, including MEDLINEplus, a database for patients and consumers. The instructors will also discuss services of the LSUSD Library available to dentists.

The lecture will last 1 1/2 hours, followed by 30 minutes of hands-on practice at computers in the library. Please call 619-8584 to register by phone.

Dr. Dummett heads LSU's pediatric dentistry department

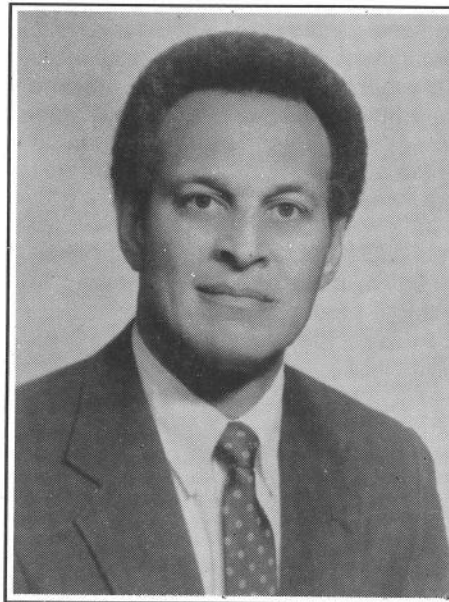
LSU School of Dentistry has appointed Dr. Clifton O. Dummett, Jr., head of its department of pediatric dentistry. A professor of pediatric dentistry, he is also coordinator of postgraduate pediatric dentistry for LSUSD and chief of the pediatric dentistry section of Charity Hospital at New Orleans.

A fellow of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry since 1975, he is also a diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and fellow in the American College of Dentists.

He has held numerous positions in the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD), including being elected to its Board of Trustees for a three-year term in 1993. From 1981 to 1995, he was one of the three-member faculty who presented the AAPD "Pediatric Dentistry Review Course" for candidates preparing for AAPD board certification, and he has served as a consultant to the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry.

He has served as chair of the pediatric dentistry section of the American Association of Dental Schools. Since 1985 he has been a consultant to the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation for Advanced Education Programs on Pediatric Dentistry.

He lectures nationwide on pediatric dental trauma and pediatric pulp therapy, which are his primary research interests.

Prior to his appointment to the LSUSD faculty in 1974, he was coordinator of dental research at Children's Medical Center, Dayton, Ohio, and served as chair of its Research and Education Committee. Dr. Dummett received his AB degree from Earlham College; his DDS from Indiana University School of Dentistry; his MSD degree from Indiana and his MEd. degree from the University of New Orleans.

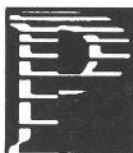

Dr. Champagne: A Varied Career

Few dentists in America have had as varied a career as Dr. Hugh P. Champagne who currently serves as Supreme Grand Master of Delta Sigma Delta international dental fraternity.

The organization has 25,000 members throughout the world. Dr. Champagne was elected at the fraternity's meeting in Hawaii in October of last year.

Born in Algiers, he practices in Gretna. But his varied interests and careers have taken him to many far-flung places. Dr. Champagne is an eighth generation Louisianian, his oldest ancestor arriving in the French colony of Louisiana in 1721.

Moving with his family to San Francisco in 1944, he graduated from St. Ignatius College Prep, a Jesuit institution, where he was in the honors class, competed on the track team and had a lead role in the senior play.

Then came pre-med studies at the University of San Francisco, where he also worked summers and holidays with the Southern Pacific railroad. When his family moved back to New Orleans, he transferred to Tulane's pre-med curriculum, graduating in 1955 with his BS in zoology and a minor in physics and chemistry.

He joined the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries as an oyster biologist, where he played a prominent role in the creation of a map showing all oyster leases in the state. Prior to this, there was no master map of oyster leases.

At the request of his Tulane physiology professor, Dr. Champagne was invited by the U.S. Army to join its 18th Chemical Technical Intelligence detachment as chemical technical intelligence officer.

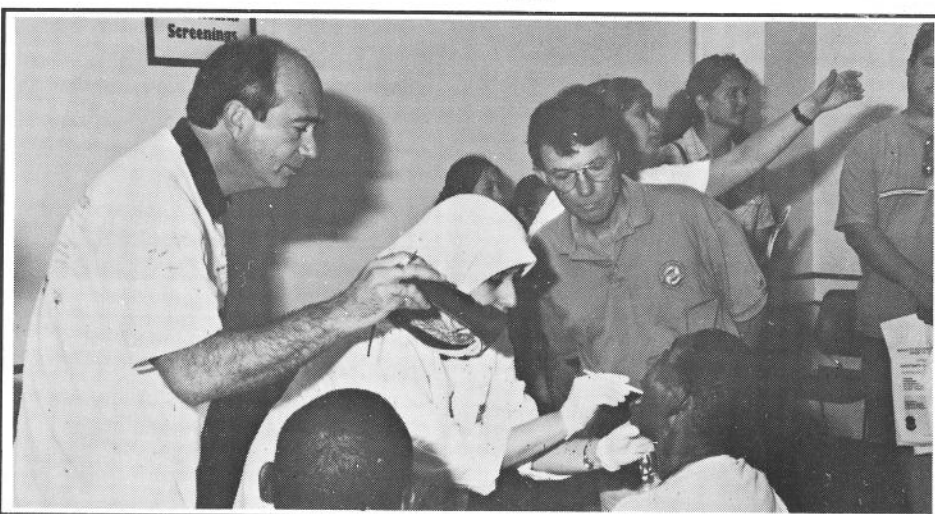
Upon his discharge, he returned to Louisiana and his career as oyster biologist. He assisted in developing the state's biological laboratory at Grand Terre, LA which is named for his first superior, Dr. Lyle St. Amant.

Then dentistry entered his life. He enrolled in the Loyola University Dental School in 1957, joined Delta Sigma Delta, served as class treasurer for four years, won a Public Health research grant in crown and bridge, was elected to C. Victor Vignes honor society, all while working at night at First National Bank and Trust.

Dr. Champagne had four children while he was in school and three more after graduation. In 1961 he opened his practice first in Baton Rouge and then in Gretna where he practices today at 12-A Westbank Expressway, Suite 200.

He has served for 20 years on the board of directors of the Krewe of Allah which he proudly points out is "the largest daytime parade in Mardi Gras."

Delta Sigma Delta is the oldest and largest dental fraternity with 25,000 members worldwide.

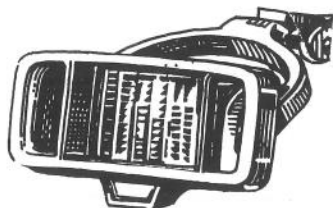
