The CPA firm of Pailet and Meunier recently conducted a survey of NODA dental offices seeking information on time allocation, expenses and other data. NODA News this month prints excerpts from that survey.

According to Kenneth C. Pailet, partner in the firm, the attached are assemblies of statistical data.

He points out "it is interesting to note that operating expenses ranged from 46% of fees to over 100%, with the average being 66.29%.

The survey findings printed below present only hourly findings and general management information. Nothing regarding fees or other financial data is presented because of possible anti-trust prohibitions.

## **NODA PROFILE**

## NODA's Ned: Benevolent Dictator?

Some may have said he was crazy. Others called him a bear for punishment.

But those who know Ned Ganucheau weren't too surprised when he accepted a second term as NODA president within a period of three years. He was elected to an unprecedented second term in 1983 after serving as president in 1981.

Dr. Edmond J. Ganucheau, Jr. likes to work. And he likes to get things done. Not given to small talk, Ned comes over as a no-nonsense, almost gruff individual, until one notices a slight twinkle in the eye and a bit of a smile playing at the corners of his mouth.

In his committee assignments for the Conference and the association he is known as a tough negotiator. His self-described philosophy: Benevolent Dictator. But no one doubts his dedication. He lists his priorities in life as: 1st God, 2nd Family, 3rd Profession, 4th Self.

His other side asserts itself in his personal motto: "To Health, to Wealth, to Love and the time to enjoy them all."

Dr. Ganucheau has been an achiever since his days as an Eagle Scout (bronze, silver and gold palms) and student at Jesuit High School. At Loyola Dental School he received the D.S.D. Fraternity Outstanding Senior Award.

This dedication has continued since he opened his practice which he continues today at his office on Houma Blvd. in Metairie. He was chairman of the New Orleans Dental Conference in 1977 and has served as member and chairman of many NODA, NODC and LDA committees.

He has given scientific presentations before the Conference, LDA annual meetings, and the Chicago Dental Society. He served as vice chairman of the ADA annual session in New Orleans in 1980 and is a member and president of the Eastman Study Group, member of the Conference on Dental Meetings and the Pierre Fauchaud Academy. He is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists and the Academy of General Dentistry. He continues to be active in NODA as a board member and director to the LDA.

Outside the office, Dr. Ganucheau's interests vary widely but lean strongly in the direction of community service. He was on the board of advisors of the Loyola School of Dental Hygiene and currently serves on the board of the university's Alumni Association. He is a member of the area Donated Dental Services program. Active in St. Philip Neri Parish and in Boy Scout and Cub Scout work, he has been on the Board of Ridgewood Prep and is a 3rd degree Knight of Columbus.

He is a member of the Krewe of Carrollton and finds time to pursue cabinet and wood working, fishing, big game hunting and gourmet cooking. Dr. Ganucheau and his late wife Janet raised a family of four sons, Eddie 28, Alan 26, Byron 25 and Paul 12.

With all this to his credit, Ned Ganucheau has not noticeably slowed down. Who knows, maybe a third presidential term lies somewhere in the future.
